WHAT'S HAPPENING?

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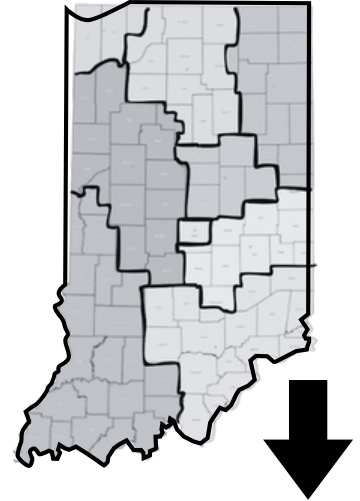
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There is a well-established procedure in place for redrawing maps: it happens every 10 years, after the census. But this plan would ignore that procedure, redrawing them 6 years early. These new maps would gerrymander our voting districts - essentially rigging the maps to pre-determine the outcome. It's an expensive process, and it doesn't represent voters fairly.

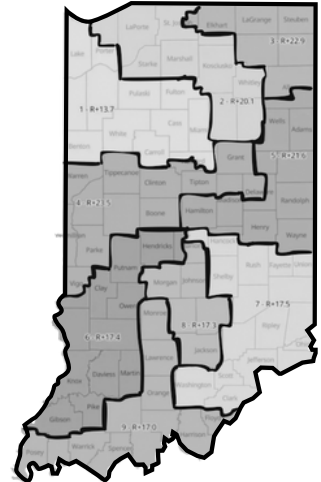
WHY SHOULD YOU OPPOSE EARLY REDISTRICTING?

- **It's cheating.** By redrawing voting maps 6 years ahead of schedule, Republicans would be able to control the process and gerrymander districts in their favor, ultimately rigging the 2026 elections.
- **It's expensive and doesn't help Hoosiers.** Developing maps and the inevitable legal challenges will be expensive. Indiana already cut funding for early education, public health, public media, and childcare, even as property taxes, housing, groceries, and more are increasingly unaffordable. Our tax dollars should serve Hoosiers and fix real problems facing them.
- **It's unpopular.** Over half of Hoosier voters oppose early redistricting, regardless of political affiliation. North Star Opinion Research
- **It damages democracy.** Red states have fewer guardrails to protect democracy than Blue states. 74% of Red states allow gerrymandering, compared to 44% of Blue states. By manipulating the maps, politicians can choose the voters most likely to vote for them, rather than fairly representing the people. American Redistricting Project
